

We are looking forward to more fun learning, new experiences and all our festivities in the second half of the







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


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Class 1KM

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
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<u>Class 1SP</u>


It has been an incredible start to the year over at 1SP! Amazing resilience shown from our pupils having settled in well from EYFS.

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Class 2AW


We have had a super start to the year In 2AW and the children have settled in really well. I am very proud of each one of them, especially in terms of the resilience they are showing when completing their work.

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


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<u>Class 3NP</u>

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


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<u>Class 3EM</u>



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
Class 4DS

It has been a great start to year 4. Well done to all 4DS for their positive attitudes towards their learning.

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

Overall, I want to say a big 'well done' to all the children: they've gotten off to a fabulous start and I'm really looking forward to what we'll learn next term!

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
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What an excellent first half term it has been in 5SJ!
